

11 October was not observed due to crossing the International Date Line.

The 630th Engineer Company (LE) debarked 26 October and established its bivouac area at Phu Thanh (Happy) Valley approximately 10 miles West Southwest of Qui Nhon.

On 28 October the company received its first promotion allocations in Viet Nam. There were four (4) E-6 promotions: Staff Sergeants James B. Hines, Cecil C. Chastain, Robert L Jones, and Euris J. Rodrigue.

The company was assigned to the 18th Engineer Brigade effective 24 October by GO 1445, Headquarters, United States Army Viet Nam. It was then attached to the 937th Engineer Group (Combat) effective the same day by GO 8, Headquarters, 18th Engineer Brigade.

On 24 November Master Sergeant E7 Joe J. Farkas, Maintenance Sergeant for the 630th Engineer Company (LE) was promoted to Master Sergeant E8 and transferred to the 18th Engineer Brigade. Msgt Farkas had previously been promoted to E7 while in this company and in route to Korea in 1950.

Forty percent of the company's equipment was off loaded from the African Neptune between 7 and 13 December at which time the ship was sent to Cam Rahn Bay to utilize their heavy lift capabilities to complete off loading. The African Neptune went to Manila between 15 and 23 December to take on rations. As of 31 December 60% of the company's equipment was located at Cam Rahn Bay aboard the African Neptune.
